



hen my mother died, her house was emptied suddenly and without warning by her love John. The charity shops of Bedfordshire dispersed the rare and precious things of Lilac Walk, a lost hoard never to be retrieved.











Continuing the series of deeply personal graphic works appearing throughout the exhibition, 'These Foolish Things' recalls a hoard of sentimental treasured objects lost in the wake of the death of the artist's mother. Adopting the style of the illustrated diagrams featured in children's educational magazine 'Look and Learn', collected in red leatherette binders throughout the seventies and eighties by the Brimfield family, the drawing maps a lexicon of grief, loss and shared familial memory. The lost objects are notionally found and collected here in a gentle act of remembrance and memorial.
