Speaker: RON

The shirt, build the, and here we are gonna investigate the role of afor and textile in the circular garment configuration. And if it contributes to attachment and connection. To answer this question, we invited you to build a shirt. We have this shirt here, and it's made out of several parts, which are connected through these poppers over here. And then on the videos, it's a little bit all over the place. You can see how it can be attached and detached from this prototype here. And in this wall, you have all the models that we have of the elements that you can change. The idea is that you keep changing the design until you are satisfied with it. And make it your own. And while you do that, I will shoot some questions and start the conversations about this whole thing.

Speaker: Participant 10

Excellent.

Speaker: RON

Yeah. Shall we start?

Speaker: Participant 10

Yes, please.

Speaker: RON

Okay. Another thing, you can work on the mannequin, or if you want, you can put it here on the table. It's up to you.

Speaker: Participant 10

Cool. Cool. I'll look at the mannequin first, I think.

Speaker: RON

Yeah. Yeah. I think it's a good strategy cuz there's already like a structure. Yeah.

Speaker: Participant 10

Cool.

Okay. Okay. So how do we start? I will put everything here to be close to you. So this is the collar?

Speaker: Participant 10

Yep.

Speaker: RON

Another option is the cuff.

Speaker: Participant 10

Okay.

Speaker: RON

You can also put pockets in three different places. Here, here and here.

Speaker: Participant 10

Yep.

Speaker: RON

You can change the hem, which is this part of the clothes.

Speaker: Participant 10

So you can make it longer.

Speaker: RON

Yeah. Yeah. That one is longer. This one is shorter. Yeah. The back, this one is the long version and here is like the short version. Yeah. Yep. And this side, you have these two options. This one with this little belt and it's more wide. And this one is, you know, like more straight, flat.

Speaker: Participant 10

Good. Alright. Yeah. Nice one.

Speaker: RON

So how do we begin?

Speaker: Participant 10

I think my instinct just to go from the top to the bottom. Gonna have a look at the collar.

Okay. It's like reading, no, like a,

Speaker: Participant 10

Yeah. From the beginning to the end.

Speaker: RON

So I have these two options of collars.

Speaker: Participant 10

That might it be my accent. But I've got a different accent.

Speaker: RON

Okay. I trust your pronunciation better than mine.

Speaker: Participant 10

Okay. I already like it with the collar. It's got its little popper there, so it's gonna see what looks like.

Speaker: RON

Ah, okay. And then you...

Speaker: Participant 10

Yeah, I like it.

Speaker: RON

You like it? There's one extra button here in the back. Maybe should.

Speaker: Participant 10

Oh right. Okay. I see a little popper. Oh, does that go inside?

Speaker: RON

Yes. They go inside. There we go. And then you set up like a know, like wrap it.

Speaker: Participant 10

Yes. Okay.

Speaker: RON

Okay. Here we go. Do you like it?

I do. I already like it with the collar.

Speaker: RON

Do you think there are these options that we have here? They are enough? Or would you like to see something different?

Speaker: Participant 10

What I do like, I dunno if you've seen from some of the clothes I wear, I love a good cuff. So I would maybe, if I was going to add something, I think it's really comprehensive. But if I were going to add something, I'd love like an option for a cuff. I love like the flowy cuffs and stuff. Maybe it's cause I'm a woman, maybe Something here. So I think if I was going to, if there was anything that I was going to say that I wanted extra, it would be something I could attach on to the end of here to give it a bit of theatricality. That's just my style. So that'd be, that would be something.

Speaker: RON

Okay. And about the collar, would you like to have other options?

Speaker: Participant 10

maybe. Yeah. Cause I really like to pick a pairing collar. Yeah. Yeah. That would be, it'd be nice to have different options for a collar actually. Yeah. I think that's really nice collar. But yeah, I think different shapes.

Speaker: RON

Different shapes like round

Speaker: Participant 10

Maybe. Depending on how you feel as well.

Speaker: RON

Well, what do you mean?

Speaker: Participant 10

Oh, like, you know how men's shirts used to come collarless? So you'd buy collars to put onto them. It could even be,...if you're looking at retail, say I'm buying like a woman's jacket and I can buy like a series of collars with it. So like, depending on what I want that day, I can like change the collar. I like the idea of that.

Speaker: RON

Yeah, yeah, yeah.

You can add a bit of variation to a garment.

Speaker: RON

Yeah. So like the styles, different styles.

Speaker: Participant 10

Yeah. Yeah. That would be really cool.

Speaker: RON

Okay. Nice.

Speaker: Participant 10

Just Looking, I really like these little type things there.

Speaker: RON

Okay. So, easy you might keep.

Speaker: Participant 10

I'm Gonna keep that.

Speaker: Participant 10

Okay.

Speaker: Participant 10

I'm curious about maybe having a longer handline.

Speaker: RON

Okay. So shall we try?

Speaker: Participant 10

I'll try, but I, I dunno, but I wanna experiment.

Speaker: RON

Yeah. Yeah. No, now's the time to experiment. Sometimes we imagine something when we try it is different, ... So let's see. Just pay attention to which side is this?

Speaker: Participant 10

When I try on, I won't change my mind.

So yeah, this happens. You can try on any time

Speaker: Participant 10

I must try it on in a minute actually just see what happens.

Speaker: RON

Cause after try I have other set of questions for you.

Speaker: Participant 10

Okay. I'll try it and I'll see ...

Speaker: RON

Do you feel like you are designing the cloth or ...

Speaker: Participant 10

Yeah, I do. Yeah. It feels, because it's so hands on, cuz it's not like I'm telling someone what to do. I'm doing it myself so I can kind of experiment. So it really does feel like I'm designing it.

Speaker: RON

I see.

Speaker: Participant 10

Rather than, I guess, what's the word? Customising or something. It feels like it's, it feels like I'm making it myself.

Speaker: RON

I see. I see. Would you like to have like more control of the design? Less control? Or you think this is fine?

Speaker: Participant 10

I think this is fine because I think I need your guidance. Oh, so this is my jumper, a bit chunky. Yeah. Would've been better if I wore a smaller jumper.

Speaker: RON

Yeah.

Speaker: Participant 10

Do I like these long hands? I'm just gonna do this to fill, actually I do. You do? I prefer Them. Because I'd wear, maybe wear this with, ...

Speaker: RON

So I mean now that you're wearing it, I would like to ask you if you have any concerns regarding this, the modularity in the garment. Something that I don't know makes you uncomfortable or worries you?

Speaker: Participant 10

Not so much worries. I would say in terms of having more options, it would be quite nice to have like another option here. I'm just thinking of bust for women to have like more of an option to have more or less space on the bust area. Oh. Because it does feel slightly, not small, but it feels like as you go throughout life and your body changes, it would be quite good to have an option to change if that makes sense.

Speaker: RON

Okay. more this part

Speaker: Participant 10

Buster area.

Speaker: RON

Yeah. Okay.

Speaker: Participant 10

But I, I dunno, let me, these bits need to be tied.

Speaker: RON

....

So like your consensus related to the shape, do they design it themselves? Yes. Yeah. Yeah.

Speaker: Participant 10

Okay. Yeah. So, more what I can kind of do with the design. If I were going to have a garment for Life

Speaker: RON

and the way it fits? or,

Speaker: Participant 10

But again, I appreciate I'm wearing a big jumper. Yeah. But yeah. But no, I like it. I think do I want, want a longer, I think at the back, maybe

This is, yeah, it's shorter on the back,

Speaker: Participant 10

Right? It's short in the back. Yeah. I'm gonna put the knee back on.

Speaker: RON

I think that we need to go back to the mannequin, I'm afraid.

Speaker: Participant 10

Yes. That's okay.

Speaker: RON

Interesting. So let me give you the, the back.... And imagine now that you go to the store, and they offere you this shirt. You made the design, you changed it, and then you bought it. How would you imagine taking care of it?

Speaker: Participant 10

I think seen as it's so far removed from a kind of fast, faraway fashion and it would be very much an investment piece.

Speaker: RON

Oh, so it would pay more for this? Yes,

Speaker: Participant 10

Definitely.

Speaker: RON

Okay.

Speaker: Participant 10

I think because I've put so much effort into designing it in the store, I'd really see it as an investment piece. So I think a lot about it before I bought it. But then once I bought it, I'd be taking a lot of care of it. So I think I hand wash It.

Speaker: RON

Hand wash it?

Speaker: Participant 10

Yeah.

Altogether or separated?

Speaker: Participant 10

All good, Question.

Speaker: RON

I learned one term is spot wash,

Speaker: Participant 10

Spot wash. I do that quite a lot. Cause I buy quite a lot of like silk, I spot wash that. Yeah. Cause you can't handle the washing machine.

Speaker: RON

And would you do that with this?

Speaker: Participant 10

I would, yeah. So obviously at bits, I'd been washing this more than I would the back or ... This doesn't make sense to heat, to wash the collar and everything.

Speaker: RON

This would be my next question actually, that you just answered. Okay. And which parts do you think you would wash or maybe exchange the most?

Speaker: Participant 10

Oh yeah, if I were going to, it would definitely be the arms.

Speaker: RON

Arms, right? For the underatms? Yeah. Like Swiss part. Yeah, the armpits and,

Speaker: Participant 10

Okay. I think armpits. I think,

Speaker: RON

Oh, there's one part missing here.

Speaker: Participant 10

Oh, is there?

Speaker: RON

Okay. Can I quickly put together?

Speaker: Participant 10

Of course. Of course. No problem. Just realised my sleeves are getting all bunched up inside.

Speaker: RON

Okay. the sleeves. And if you go to a store, and then you bought this one, they have several options. They have....

Speaker: Participant 10

Can you do that up for me, sir?

Speaker: RON

Okay. They have different cuffs, different collars, as you said. Would you buy all of them? Would you buy some of them?

Speaker: Participant 10

Definitely, because I see such an investment, I would wanna have, if there were all these variations where I could have it different quite a lot, I would definitely want to do that like straight away. So that would be part of the experience for me. Definitely. Having the different options. Because it's quite like the dress is quite an emotional thing, so you may feel differently on any given day. So if I'm already in the mindset where I'm like, yeah, I'm gonna buy this modular shirt, yeah. I would definitely be like, oh, I can get these collar options. Yeah. I think I'd definitely do these puff options.

Speaker: RON

Okay. Yeah. And do you see this, would you rather do this at home or in a shop?

Speaker: Participant 10

Or this experience?

Speaker: RON

Yeah.

Speaker: Participant 10

Yeah, I think in a shop, because I'd want someone's opinion. I'd want a bit of guidance.

Speaker: RON

Okay. Like you mean professional guidance or could be a friend?

Both I think. Or either. I think professional guidance is really good because you can be directed in a certain way. Yeah. Yeah. Professional guidance. I think professionals like a stylist.

Speaker: RON

Yeah. And with a friend or without a Friend.

Speaker: Participant 10

I hate shopping with people,

Speaker: RON

So. Okay, so you want to take your time. okay.

Speaker: Participant 10

Oh yeah.

Speaker: RON

Okay. What next

Speaker: Participant 10

Do I want? I don't actually like pockets.

Speaker: RON

No. Okay.

Speaker: Participant 10

So no Pockets.

Speaker: RON

So burn them. Good for you. So then one of the options left the cuffs.

Speaker: Participant 10

Yes. Yes.

Speaker: RON

Yeah.

Speaker: Participant 10

I have to take it off again.

Speaker: RON

Yeah. It's a bit difficult to Yes. To do it on your own body. So like cuffs, cuffs, cuffs. Cuffs. Let me see if I have any more questions. Okay. You wore the shirt, right? And you are putting together, so eventually we're gonna finish. How do you feel? Sorry. It's like, yeah, So my question is, how do you feel if you, in relation to regular clothes, like by regular clothes? I mean the non modular...

Speaker: Participant 10

Conflict, not conflict, what's the word? It can be a bit of a conflicting relationship. Sometimes I don't, so I've got, once I got more into sustainable fashion, I started seeing like slow fashion, I guess. I started seeing more clothes, like maybe for like, I feel like I like nicer material, looked better, and they're made to like my size as well. Whereas, like, yeah, like fast fashion. Not that I buy it anymore, but it feels like it's very identical.

Speaker: RON

Yeah.

Speaker: Participant 10

So, so tight. And then sometimes, when you're on a budget, it can be a bit like, oh yeah. However, I appreciate that. Like some things are made very well, and that's better, but I really appreciate having your own input to design.

Speaker: RON

Okay.

Speaker: Participant 10

So sometimes it can feel a bit prescriptive, I suppose. So a bit like, oh this is what you are going to wear. If you like it, then good. If you don't like it, then tough. And then that's everywhere, you know what I mean? So in every clothes shop it's the same style and it's a bit ... Trends and you can be a bit like, and it's so difficult to like find something of good quality. So I appreciate the element of being able to design something yourself.

Speaker: RON

Yeah.

Speaker: Participant 10

Lots of me and my friends always say that there's something that we would like to buy, but it doesn't exist. So the fact that you could kind of make that happen by doing the modular element is like really nice. It's really interesting. Oh and it's not trends either, isn't it? It's a timeless.

So is this something that would wear with more pride?

Speaker: Participant 10

Oh definitely. Yeah, definitely. And people would be like for exactly. People would be like, where's that from? And you'd be like, well I put it together. Yes. My brain. Yeah. I'm a genius. Exactly.

Speaker: RON

I see. No, nice. Very, very Interesting.

Speaker: Participant 10

It is, yeah. I feel like I do feel like the plumbing industry's got a bit better with that, but yeah. Yeah. Sometimes it just sort of sizes as well, like within sizing is terrible. Like everything's a different size, it can be stressful.

Speaker: RON

Do you think these would help or sizing?

Speaker: Participant 10

I think so, yeah. Yeah, because I think part of it is that not, not every, you don't, not everyone just fits into like a certain size where you can control it yourself, can't you? Like I was saying with the bus. Yeah. However, the arms fit fine. Yeah. Or like, I think I get a lot with jeans when the waist span's too big.

Speaker: RON

It's just, oh yeah. My partner has this problem with trousers cause the waist is fine, but it's always short. It has really been a long leg.

Speaker: Participant 10

Yeah, yeah, yeah, yeah. Or with women, I think it's, the waist is really big, but it fits the hips. Yeah. If you have wide hips, yeah. That's all waste and it's just like,

Speaker: RON

Yeah. So, so it could change maybe only this part.

Speaker: Participant 10

Yeah, exactly. I'm gonna pick these cuffs off by the Way.

Speaker: RON

You don't like the cuffs. Interesting. I thought you would like the guy.

Speaker: RON

What's going on? About the cuffs?

Speaker: Participant 10

Yeah. You said so much about the cuff. I dunno if I feel like it makes it too long for me. I dunno.

Speaker: RON

I have to confess that I also love those like, you know, like, like Mozart of cuffs. I find them so chic. It's so dramatic, isn't it? It's so dramatic. Yeah.

Speaker: Participant 10

I've got a few of them.

Speaker: RON

You do? But it's only the cuff or?

Speaker: Participant 10

It's only the cuff. Yeah.

Speaker: RON

So it's modular.

Speaker: Participant 10

Then it's a bit, yeah, it's really, it is modular. Yeah. You don't, yeah, I don't really think about it.

Speaker: RON

Do you? Yeah, I dunno. I do quite a lot. Especially after working here.

Speaker: RON

I will be, I will be thinking about it.

Speaker: RON

Interesting.

Speaker: Participant 10

Yes. Yes. I like it.

Yeah. Okay. So does the show give you too many design options or not enough? I think we already answered that. Do they care about the design? How much? Well, I guess my questions are done. How? How do you feel? Good?

Speaker: Participant 10

Yes.

Speaker: RON

Do you want, do you want to do some, any other alteration or are you happy with it?

Speaker: Participant 10

Yeah, yeah.

Speaker: RON

Okay. That's great. I'm also happy. The next part of it is if you could come, come here. The next part is the Polaroid Wall where we can flaunt your creation. Would you like to take part? Yes,
