



Spaces online and next steps for this research

Inside here by K M Bosy

This research progresses from (while not including) 'Inside here by K M Bosy', an artwork that is preliminary to this research. It aimed to bring Correspondence Art strategies into a relationship with the grid used in cartography (GPS). This artwork used smartphone native app technology to complicate the quality of representation (of the landscape) afforded by this technology. *Inside here* is an explorative work that was included in my research proposal and, as such, predates this research. It is a marker for where the research progresses from in the art practice more generally.

itinerant space academic journal

The practice instigated a collaborative approach in 2020 to develop an online platform. In a progression from the Correspondence Art strategy of image calls, *itinerant space* uses a keyword structure. Art and design research practice is published in the form of digital video and other time-based work, still images, and text. The journal was developed in 2020 and the pilot was launched in 2021.

vault, 2019 (Part 1 research exploration) was published on *itinerant space* during an experimental time for this journal. Subsequently, the role of an issue editor, for issues 1 and 2, was added to the role of a founding editor. The resultant academic research journal *itinerant space* published Issue 2: iterations in 2024.
